1) Call to Order – Curtis

2) Review and Approval of March 14 Minutes – Moore/All

Barbara Ostergaard moved to accept the Booster Board Meeting Minutes. Doug Wright seconded the motion. All approved.

3) Treasurer's Report – Ostergaard/All

- Adjustment on the minutes of \$40 per student for overpayment for the Disney trip.
- The Disney trip finances are complete, so those are final numbers. The reason the expense numbers are higher than the income is that many students earned Disney credits by selling above the expectation of fruit, and that money went toward their trip from the band account.
- The scholarship line is confusing because there was \$1200 deposited into the account on a return from last year after the budget was set. So there has actually been \$1,350 spent in scholarship money, though only \$150 shows.
- There are two outstanding checks from June that I hope Mrs. Kempsell and Mrs. Farrison will cash soon.
- The club account for Band is overdrawn on the paper because Steve DeRees wasn't notified (as he has been in the past) when his account is getting low. So a large check was required to bring the band club account back into the black. The accounting of the money is not a concern for us as he has it in his account and is making adjustments according to what he spent the money on. We don't micromanage the spending, we just make sure that the groups stay within their

allotted amount, and try to show the initial budget amount against the actual in the end. The teachers can move the money around as needed.

MOTION: Rose Martin moved to accept the Treasurer's Report, and Jeanne Ridley seconded it. All approved.

4) Old Business

a) Jazz and More – Ridley

- Table reservations began March 1 and, as of this evening, we have 201 seats spoken for out of 230 available (199 sold, 2 gratis). Formal ticket sales end on Friday, April 14, but we will leave the website open for buy/sell transactions arranged by private parties. A post spring-break reminder has been emailed. Families needing gratis seats will be accommodated and should contact Mr. DeRees by this Friday. We want to open reservations up to Jefferson families as well and will see if Mrs. Bruski can issue an email tomorrow.
- Event advertising has been included in the MPS Communique, the Dow High newsletter, and has been requested of MCTV. A detailed flyer was emailed to Booster members today to post in their own circles or on social media. Anna Hales developed a very attractive Art Deco poster which has been posted locally in at least 16 organizations. She needs final content so that the program design can take place and print copies produced on time for the event.
- At the last Booster meeting, we had three sponsors at the \$250 level. After aggressively pursuing business sponsorships and developing a family match concept with a Dow music alumni family, we were able to push past our \$3500 financial sponsorship forecast to reach \$5100 in commitments with \$4000 in hand. We have the following sponsorships committed: 11 at \$250, 1 at \$150, 7 at \$100, and 3 at \$500. Sponsors will be posted to our website soon and will also be listed in the event program. We had both new and continuing sponsors, and we developed a worksheet to track prospects, contact dates, responsible parties, and result, which will help the 2018 team. New \$100+ sponsors this year include Wolverine Bank, Glover Pharmacy, Members First Credit Union, Greater Midland Tennis Center, Bushey Automotive, Kutchey Landscaping, Radio Wasteland Records and many music families. We were pleased to have returning sponsors as well. We also received heavy contributions from our committee families.
- All silent auction items will be ready for photography this Thursday. Claudie
 will be posting photos to the web and then Julie will send out an email to
 ticket purchasers to advertise the items ahead of time. Jen and Barbara met
 to set up the Square POS reader to handle credit card transactions during the
 night for a small fee. We can also use this with table donations.
- The Charger Shoppe will display a few silent auction items this week for sealed bid, and next week they will be displayed in the showcase. The sealed bid box is in the front office. Bids end on April 27th at noon with winners notified April 28th. We will draft an email once the display is set.
- We still need NHS volunteers for the event.

- Rose Martin's friend Kim Gleason has agreed to photograph the event for us.
- Michael Hales mentioned needing volunteers for pick up and set up of the instruments at MCC by 2PM.
