**a. February Meeting Minutes – Rhee** A copy of the February minutes were passed around for those present to review.

## b. Treasurer's Report - B. Ostergaard

- Barbara distributed copies of the Budget and Activity Report for 2017/2018 through 3/13/2018 along with a written write-up. Those items were discussed.
- Two Scholarships each for Orchestra and Choir have been acknowledged for students. The scholarships were credits toward their trips. A scholarship for a flute was awarded.
- An adjustment needs to be made to the Fundraising Outflow line item from Choir to Orchestra for \$6,500.
- Barbara will start training the new Treasurer for next year.

# 3) New Business

# a. Ren Fair – Thoms/Hales

 Gross ticket sales were \$11,826. It takes the Midland Center for the Arts 4-6 weeks to process ticket sales, they take their 10%, deduct the rental fee and any other expenses and report the net income to us. After our estimated expenses, we expect to profit \$6,000 - \$7,000. This was a success! The net profit will be divided evenly between the 3 music departments.

- David Wolfley, our stage manager, did a wonderful job. He worked on this event for two weeks in advance with MCFTA. He was awesome!
- We are looking to change the date to November this next school year. If we do, Mr. DeRees will bring out the marching band.
- The Music Booster Club fronted \$1,555 for RenFair. We discussed adding a new budget line for RenFair start-up costs to account for this under Booster Club Overhead. Then, the entire net income received from the Midland Center for the Arts can be divided evenly and added to the three music departments budgets. Kirsten Cochran proposed that we absorb the \$1,555 in Overhead and the net income from RenFair be added to the music department budgets. Barbara Ostergaard seconded this. The motion passed by the majority.

## b. Jazz & More - Todd Ostergaard

- Committee planning and plan execution are well underway. We have been meeting since December.
- Ticket sales for the event went live the Monday after RenFair. With only a couple of small glitches, ticket sales are going well.
- To date, we have sold 17 of the 26 tables. (170 tickets sold.)
- Single tickets go on sale March 11. Tell your friends and family!
- Jim Hoemeyer has accepted the invitation to be this year's emcee for which we are very excited.
- We are still working on the silent auction. Last year, over \$4,000 was raised by the auction but it was a significant amount of work.
  This year, we will have a reduced version of the auction and are not expecting as much income.
- Reminder to the directors: program details need to be finalized and turned in to the committee by March 14. This will allow time to finish design and get it printed for the event.
- We will offer Curt Gledhill 2 comped tickets for making the cello art.

#### a. Choir – Farison

- On March 23, the choirs will have a second lock-in with Midland HS at Midland HS. It will be over night with movies, popcorn, dance. Will set up a SignUp Genius for parent volunteers to help with shifts.
- The choirs were successful at the Choir Festival. The Chorus scored high 1s. The Chamber Singers earned a perfect score on everything. One judge gave them a standing ovation.

#### b. Orchestra - Thoms

- A big THANK YOU for everything you have done in the past six weeks to make our music program a success! These include: Michigan Music Conference, Fruit Sale, RenFair and hosting the MSBOA District V Band and Orchestra Festival.
- It's been two years since last music portraits have been taken. Lee Schaffert will photograph all groups on April 17, 18 and 19. Band will wear marching uniforms, orchestra wears tuxes and choir wears dresses and tuxes. Students can order photos. Lee usually comps the composite pictures depending upon how many students order prints. Framing is the cost to us.
- Over a dozen students attended the Ray Chen masterclass. He is one of the most famous violinists today. It was a great

- experience. Students were able to watch a master class, watch a short performance, play with him and take selfies.
- Over 70 band and orchestra students participated in Solo and Ensemble on Saturday, February 10. Dow High students earned 53 first division ratings and 14 second division ratings.
