2) Review and approve

a. Minutes - Karen Rhee

- There was one change recommended to the November minutes specifying that the maestro sponsor could designate 25% of the donation to the event of their choice. Karen will make this change.
- Karen thanks everyone who provides her with an email of their reports to assist with meeting minutes.

b. Treasurer's report as of January 8, 2019 - Carolyn Southwick

- Carolyn distributed a copy of the 1/08/2019 report to attendees.
- Other Fundraising Expenses of \$4,790 is Midland HS share (1/2) of the Marching Band Showcase income. Carolyn will adjust the budget numbers to gross up the Marching Band Showcase revenue and reflect expense for the shared half.
- Choir Other Fundraising income reflects income from the Century Resources fundraiser and the madrigal dinner.
- Two large deposits made today will be reflected in next month's numbers: \$8,854.55 for RenFair and approximately \$11,000 from Fruit Sale.
- Michael Hales stated that if we bring in more net income then budgeted, we could increase the amounts available for directors to spend.

c. Approval Kim Birch made a motion to approve the November meeting minutes. Karen Dastick seconded. They were both unanimously approved.

3) Business

a. RenFair recap - Kim Birch

- Gross ticket sales were \$13,149: 555 adult, 351 student and 66 complimentary tickets. This is up \$1,323 from last year. After expenses, net income is \$7,698.25. The sponsorship drive resulted in \$3,111 allocated to RenFair, for a grand total net income of \$10,809.25. Consistent with the prior year, net income will be divided evenly between the three music groups.
- November 16, 2019 is the tentative date for next year. We plan to schedule the third weekend of November going forward. This will coincide with the Santa Parade every three years. We can officially request this date on March 1.
- The MCFTA is a fantastic partner and supporter of this event. It is amazing to watch the backstage crew of seasoned professionals and parent/student volunteers pull together the entire event during one rehearsal on the day of the performance.
- The MCFTA staff were able to coordinate the three events smoothly and sent a complimentary "Know Before You Go" email to help with parking and people movement on the day of the event.
- David Wolfley continues to be a big asset to the production and we confirmed his availability before committing to the date for next year.
- We gifted Curt Gledhill with a token of appreciation for his efforts and many hours working on the RenFair program, staff dance and all around support of RenFair performers and crew.
- A big THANK YOU to everyone who volunteered for RenFair! We could not make it happen without you. We have a small token of appreciation for you.
- The RenFair Planning Committee included Amanda Thoms as lead music director, Ken and Bobbi Arthur as ticket coordinators, Lori

- Peterson as program coordinator, and Kim Birch as booster liaison and volunteer coordinator. Deb Ahn will join our team next year.
- Planning is underway for RenFair 2019 with audition dates to be announced in the spring before the school year end.
- A report of final expenses and proposed budget for next year was submitted.

b. Fruit Sale – Kirsten Joy-Cochran

- After two tally days, have collected roughly \$30,000 in sales.
 Additionally, we have received \$5,000 in sponsorship money for this fundraiser.
- We anticipate a big order turn-in on Wednesday, so we expect to meet our goal in \$55,000 in total income.
- We will finish with one final sweep on Friday and cut-off preorders at that point. Online orders will be cut off on Thursday at 11:59 pm. The order will be submitted to Jack's in the middle of next week.
- We've had good support from volunteers so far. We still need lots of help for delivery weekend and will sent out more reminders as we get closer. The Committee has been g reat and things have been running smoothly.
- We are waiting to hear from Kurt (from Jack's Fruit Market) regarding pricing.
